Orangeville, July 23, 2018 – A group of community stakeholders – representatives from several collaborating not-for-profit local agencies – installed a memorial plaque at Dods & McNair Funeral Home.

The plaque was installed in front of a tree located at Dods & McNair with the intention of memorializing those who have lost their lives to overdose. The plaque reads, “This tree has been planted in memory of those we’ve loved and lost to addiction.” It is a beautiful spot and the committee hopes that family members and friends of those lost to overdose addiction will find some comfort when visiting the tree.

In Dufferin and Caledon, we are not immune to this epidemic. Local emergency responders have noticed a significant increase in overdose cases within the community in the last two years. As a result, collaborating agencies in Dufferin and Caledon want to raise awareness and educate to help prevent future tragedies.

International Overdose Awareness Day is a global event held on August 31st each year with the goal of raising awareness of overdose and reducing the stigma of a drug-related death. This event also acknowledges the grief felt by families and friends who remember those who have met with death or permanent injury as a result of drug overdose.

The community is invited to attend the 2nd annual **Overdose Awareness barbecue and health fair**, which will be held on **Thursday, August 30th** at the Edelbrock Centre, from 11:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m. The event will also include thoughtful words spoken by community partners and a survivor’s story.
