

SHELTER COUNSELLOR 1 Year Contract—Full-time

Under the direction of the Shelter Supervisor, a Shelter Counsellor is responsible for the operation of a 24 hour Emergency Shelter for women and their children who have experienced abuse.

Responsibilities will include:

- Providing supportive counselling, information and referral to appropriate legal, medical and housing services, and other community resources
- Responding appropriately on the crisis telephone line, text messages and walk-ins
- Completion of administrative tasks (e.g., record keeping, intake procedures, reports, data entry)
- Routine maintenance and security procedures

Qualifications and Core Competencies:

- Post-Secondary Education in the Social Service field or equivalent experience and specialized training
- Registered or eligible for registration with OCSWSSW
- Knowledge of violence against women and children, mental health, addictions and homelessness issues
- Feminist / ARAO/ Intersectionality working perspective
- Interpersonal and conflict resolution skills
- Crisis intervention and problem solving skills
- Strong supportive and non-judgemental listening, empathy and interpersonal skills
- Communication and report writing skills
- Organizational skills and the ability to prioritize
- Ability to work both cooperatively as a team member and independently
- Advanced knowledge of community resources and how to access them
- Skills in the use of a personal computer for word processing
- Knowledge of shelter facility management
- Police Vulnerable Sector Check
